Initiatives and Programs

The main goal of Illinois Computing Educators is to provide opportunities for educators to learn about new technology resources and effective classroom strategies from other members or from recognized experts. Some of these initiatives include:

Chapter Activities: There are currently ten chapters established across the state of Illinois to serve members on a local level. Chapter activities include special mini-conference events, presentations, and social events that help to bring educators together to share and explore new ideas. Chapter blogs, wikis, and listservs are also used to build learning communities across the state.

Advocacy Programs: ICE has nurtured working relationships with state and Federal agencies to help educators in their efforts to communicate their views and visions with elected officials. The annual TECH 2010 event held at the Capitol Building in Springfield each year has a twofold purpose—to raise awareness of the critical role that technology plays in preparing students for the future, and to demonstrate the need for continued support and funding for classroom technology resources.

Professional Partnerships: ICE has established working partnerships with several other professional organizations in an effort to support our mutual interests and serve our members in a more comprehensive way. Currently, ICE maintains partnerships with leading organizations including the Illinois School Library Media Association (ISLMA), the Illinois Association of School Business Officials (IASBO), and the Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE).



Member Benefits

Since ICE is a non-profit organization, all member dues go directly to the development and support of special programs that are available to all members. The following are included among the benefits:

- ★ **Atomic Learning:** ICE members have access to this website that features thousands of “just-in-time” video learning modules that cover a wide range of topics including assistive technology resources, software applications, and technology integration strategies. - ★ **ICE Conference:** The annual four-day conference includes two days of “hands-on” pre-conference workshops, half-day workshops, keynote speakers, nearly 200 vendors, and a wide variety of breakout sessions that focus on innovative and practical strategies for infusing technology resources into classroom activities. Registration fees for the annual ICE Conference include a one-year membership to ICE.
- ★ **ICE Scholarship Program:** Each year, several ICE members receive scholarship awards in amounts up to \$1,000 to assist them with expenses as they pursue advanced degrees or attend professional development workshops or conferences. Scholarship funds are also available for the sons and daughters of ICE members who are pursuing degrees in Education.
- ★ **ICE Cube Newsletter:** The quarterly ICE publication contains relevant information on new technology resources, standards-based learning, and effective classroom strategies. The newsletter is mailed to all members and an archive library of past issues is posted on the ICE web site.
- ★ **Big Deal Book of Technology:** The Big Deal books are filled with information about valuable web sites, financial grant programs, new technologies, and free materials. ICE members receive e-mail versions twice each month and printed copies twice each year.
